15th Annual English and Western Horseshow September 24/25/26, 2010

This show will be run under HCBC General Performance Rules and is a BC Heritage Qualifier. BCHQ classes are marked HQ.

Entry Fees:

Dressage classes \$10.00

All other classes \$7.00

Stabling: A limited number of box stalls are available at \$10.00 per night. Entries must be accompanied by a \$25.00 refundable stall deposit with cheque made out to Pass Creek Regional Exhibition Society.

Refunds: only with a Vet or Doctor's certification of inability of horse or rider to compete.

Ribbons to 6th place. Prize money will be awarded as follows: 1st place \$5, 2nd place \$3, 3rd place \$2. Awards for High Point winners.

Insurance: A copy of your HCBC membership must accompany your entry. You can join on line prior to the show at www.hcbc.com or by calling 1-800-345-8055.

Age Categories: as of January 1st of current year: Note the name changes for age categories

Junior: 13 and under. Youth: 14 – 18 Senior: 19 +

Judge: Alastair Buchanan of Abbotsford

- One entry form for each horse/rider combination.
- 3 horses constitute a class (classes may be cancelled, combined or divided) depending on entries.
- Trail classes – 5 horses will constitute a class.
- All competitors must wear proper riding boots and horses must be properly equipped.
- Approved helmets with harness are mandatory in all classes where jumps are involved.
- Approved helmets with harness are mandatory for junior and youth competitors when mounted and they are strongly recommended for senior competitors.
- Riders using abusive language or mistreating a horse in any way, may at the discretion of the Judge and/or Show Committee, be disqualified from the show. The committee may also disqualify any horse which appears ill or lame.
- Horses must be under rider or handler control at all times or they will be asked to leave the grounds. Stallions must be noted on the entry form and may NOT be shown by a junior or youth.
- Horses not entered in the show will not be allowed on the Exhibition grounds. Horses are not allowed in the concession area or spectator area.
- Junior and Youth competitors must have their entry forms signed by a parent or guardian.
- Any one entering a horse owned by someone else must have the owner's signature on their entry form.

DRESSAGE

(d) denotes point class for Dressage division only

Dressage Tests will be for the year 2010. Class 1 test will be ridden in a 20X40 metre arena, all other tests will be in a 20x60 metre arena. An ordinary snaffle bridle must be used; to be ridden with reins in both hands. Spurs and crops are optional. A maximum of 48 tests to be ridden. Tests can be found at www.dressagecanada.org

Higher level tests: Competitors may request to ride other tests of a higher level by phoning the Show Secretary prior to September 16. All tests above First Level ie classes 8a & 8b have been listed as demonstration classes.

Times will be posted at the grounds on Thursday evening. Riders may phone the Show Secretary to obtain riding times.

It is the responsibility of the exhibitors to ensure they have correct tack. Any discrepancy to the saddlery rules will incur elimination.

If there is only one competitor in a class, the competitor shall compete against a percentage of the total mark.

HUNTER OVER FENCES DIVISIONS

Horse/Rider combination may only enter one hunter over fences division.

HUNTERS – To be judged on evenness of pace, manners, style and way of going over a figure 8 course at a minimum of 8 hunter type fences. Whips no longer than 75 cm, spurs and martingales are optional. **Boots and/or bandages are not permitted.**

HUNT SEAT EQUITATION over fences– Rider to be judged on position, balance and control over a course of a minimum of 8 hunter type fences.

JUMPERS – To be judged under **Table A Article 3 AM5** – One round with a time allowed and if necessary, a timed jump-off to determine first place.

- 18 **Novice Jumper Open 2'3"– 2'6" (no cross entry with classes 21, 22)**
- 19* **Jumper Junior 2'6 – 2'9"**
- 20* **Jumper Senior 2'6"– 2'9"**
- 21 **Training Jumper Open 3'0"– 3'3"**
- 22 **Modified Welcome Jumper Open 3'6"**

ENGLISH FLAT CLASSES

- 23 **Lead Line Horsemanship** – For children 6 years and under. To be led by an adult. The rider will be judged on basic position, seat and ability to properly hold the reins and cue the mount. To be judged at a walk and jog/trot both ways of the ring. May be ridden English or Western. Complimentary ribbons for all.
- 24* HQ **English Pleasure Senior** to be shown at a flat-footed walk, normal trot and easy canter. Not to gallop. To be judged on performance, conformation and manners.
- 25* HQ **English Pleasure Youth** - same as class 24
- 26* HQ **English Pleasure Junior** - same as class 24
- 27 **Walk/Trot Pleasure--Open** same as class 24 but, rider may not enter any other class.

- 28 **Greenhorse Pleasure Open** - same as class 24 but horse never to have won 3 first place ribbons in a pleasure class under current rider.
- 29* **Basic Seat Equitation – Senior Rider** will be asked to walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Spurs and braiding are optional. **Martingales and tie-downs are prohibited.** Rider to be judged and may be called upon by the Judge for individual work. Fall of the rider constitutes elimination. Any English saddle may be used.
- 30* **Basic Seat Equitation Youth** - same as class 29
- 31* **Basic Seat Equitation Junior** - same as class 29
- 32 HQ **Hunter Under Saddle Open** - to be shown in the walk, trot and canter both directions of the arena; may be required to hand gallop; light contact with reins is permissible
- 33 HQ **Hunt Seat Equitation Open** - saddle should fit horse & rider; on the flat – stirrups should measure to just below the ankle; heel should not be forced down but when rider is in correct position the heel should drop down naturally; aids should not be obvious; walk, trot (sitting & posting) and canter will be required; judge may ask questions on horsemanship, anatomy of the horse, tack & stable management.
- 34 HQ **Hunter Hack Open** - to be shown in the walk, trot and canter both directions of the arena; may be required to hand gallop. Will be required to jump 2 fences max 2'3".
- 35*HQ **Road Hack Open** - to be shown at a flat-footed walk, trot, strong trot, canter and hand gallop. Mounting, dismounting and reining back may be requested. Martingales, boots, coloured browbands and nosebands are prohibited. To be judged on performance, conformation, substance and manners. **NO CROSS ENTRIES WITH SHOW HACK.**
- 36*HQ **Show Hack Open** – Horses to enter ring at a walk. To be shown on contact in normal, collected and extended gaits at walk, trot, canter. Hand gallop may be required. Horse expected to stand quietly. To be judged on performance, quality, conformation and manners. **NO CROSS ENTRIES WITH ROAD HACK**
- 37 HQ **Fall Fair Challenge Open: Command Class**
- 38 **Ride a Buck Open:** \$2 entry fee to be paid on entering the class. Horses to be ridden bare back, paper money will be provided. Winner is the last person to retain the money. Winner takes all.

WESTERN CLASSES

*** denotes point class for Western division*

- 39 **Halter Open** – the horse to be judged on its conformation. No stallions allowed.
- 40**HQ **Showmanship – English or Western Senior** - Horses to be shown in hand at a walk and trot as directed by Judge. Showmanship to be judged: 20% - appearance and grooming; 80% - manner in which horse is shown to the Judge. No whips. Suitable tack and attire.
- 41**HQ **Showmanship English or Western – Youth** same as class 40
- 42**HQ **Showmanship English or Western – Junior** same as class 40
- 43**HQ **Western Pleasure Senior** - Horse to be judged on performance, condition and conformation. Horse to be shown both ways of the ring at all 3 gaits with a

reasonably loose rein and light contact. Horses will be required to back up easily and stand quietly. The Judge may request extension of gaits.

- 44**HQ **Western Pleasure Youth** - same as class 43
- 45**HQ **Western Pleasure Junior** - same as class 43
- 46 **Walk/Trot Pleasure Open** - same as class 43 but, rider may not enter any other riding class.
- 47 **Greenhorse Pleasure Open** - same as class 43 but horse never to have won 3 first place ribbons in a pleasure class under current rider.
- 48**HQ **Western Horsemanship Senior** – Pattern will be posted. Rider may be required to ride at a walk, jog, and lope both ways of the ring. Fall of rider constitutes elimination. The performance of the horse is not to be judged more important than the performance, position and general equitation of the rider.
- 49**HQ **Western Horsemanship Youth** - same as class 48
- 50**HQ **Western Horsemanship Junior** - same as class 48
- 51**HQ **Western Equitation Senior** – to be judged on seat, hands, performance of horse, appointment of horse & rider, suitability of horse to rider.
- 52**HQ **Western Equitation Youth** – same as class 51
- 53**HQ **Western Equitation Junior** – same as class 51
- 54 **Jack Benny class** open to riders 44 and older to be judged as a pleasure class not restricted as to tack and attire.
- 55 **Novice Reining Open** - Horses never having won 3 firsts in reining. Splint and skid boots allowed. Pattern will be posted. May be shown two-handed in a snaffle or bosal. A novice horse is such as of January 1st of this year.
- 56** HQ **Reining Open** – Splint and skid boots allowed. Pattern will be posted. May be shown two-handed in snaffle or bosal.
- 57** HQ **Barrel Racing Senior** - No crops, whips, quirts, spurs or over and under ropes. Horse may not be hit with the ends of the reins. Proper bat may be used behind the cinch. May start either right or left following standard cloverleaf pattern. Penalty of 5 seconds for knocking over a barrel. Off course constitutes elimination. This is a timed event.
- 58** HQ **Barrel Racing Youth & Junior** - same as class 57
- 59** HQ **Pole Bending Senior** – No crops, whips, quirts, spurs or over and under ropes. Horses may not be hit with the ends of the reins. Proper bat may be used behind the cinch. Horse and Rider may run down either right or left side of the poles. At sixth pole, turn and weave poles for two laps, then run straight back and cross the finish line. Penalty of 5 seconds per pole knocked over. Off course constitutes elimination. This is a timed event.
- 60** HQ **Pole Bending Youth & Junior** - same as class 59

Trail Horse classes to be held in the Dressage Arena.

Riders may compete at their convenience between 10:00 – noon.

- 61** HQ **Trail Horse/Handy Horse Open** -- Horses to be shown at a walk, jog and lope over and through obstacles. Contestants will be allowed 30 seconds at each obstacle. If obstacle is not negotiated rider must pass on to next and so on. Off course constitutes elimination. No boots or wraps. Horse performance to be judged: 60% - manners; 20% - appointments; 20% - conformation. NO CROSS ENTRIES WITH CLASS 62.
- 62 **Trail Horse Beginner**—Horse and/or rider must be in their first year of showing in trail classes. NO CROSS ENTRIES WITH CLASS 61.
