This show will be run under HCBC General Performance Rules and is a BC Heritage Qualifier.

Entry Fees:

Dressage classes \$10.00

All other classes \$7.00

Stabling: A limited number of box stalls are available at \$10.00 per night. Entries must be accompanied by a \$25.00 refundable stall deposit with cheque made out to Pass Creek Regional Exhibition Society.

Refunds: only with a Vet or Doctor's certification of inability of horse or rider to compete.

Ribbons to 6th place. Prize money will be awarded as follows: 1st place \$5, 2nd place \$3, 3rd place \$2. Awards for High Point winners.

Insurance: A copy of your HCBC membership **MUST** accompany your entry. You can join on line prior to the show at www.hcbc.com or by calling HCBC toll free at 1-800-345-8055.

Age Categories: as of January 1st of current year: Note the name changes for age categories

Junior: 13 and under.

Youth: 14 – 18

Senior: 19 +

Judge: TBA

- **Helmets:** Youth and /or Junior competitors **must wear** properly fitted approved BSI or ASTM protective headgear, with safety harness correctly secured at all times when mounted. It is **Highly Recommended** that Adult Riders wear properly fitted approved BSI or ASTM protective headgear, with safety harness correctly secured at all times when mounted. Properly fitted approved BSI or ASTM protective headgear, with safety harness correctly secured with harness are mandatory in all classes where jumps are involved.
- Junior and Youth competitors must have their entry forms signed by a parent or legal guardian.
- One entry form for each horse/rider combination.
- Any one entering a horse owned by someone else must have the owner's signature on their entry form.
- 3 horses constitute a class (classes may be cancelled, combined or divided) depending on entries.
- Trail classes – 5 horses will constitute a class.
- All competitors must wear proper riding boots and horses must be properly equipped.
- Riders using abusive language or mistreating a horse in any way, will at the discretion of the Judge and/or Show Committee, be disqualified from the show. The committee may also disqualify any horse which appears ill or lame.
- Horses must be under rider or handler control at all times or they will be asked to leave the grounds. Stallions must be noted on the entry form and may NOT be shown by a junior or youth.
- Horses not entered in the show will not be allowed on the Exhibition grounds. Horses are not allowed in the concession area or spectator area.

HUNTER OVER FENCES DIVISIONS

Horse/Rider combination may only enter one hunter over fences division.

HUNTERS – To be judged on evenness of pace, manners, style and way of going over a figure 8 course at a minimum of 8 hunter type fences. Whips no longer than 75 cm, spurs and martingales are optional. **Boots and/or bandages are not permitted.**

HUNT SEAT EQUITATION over fences– Rider to be judged on position, balance and control over a course of a minimum of 8 hunter type fences.

LOW HUNTER DIVISION

The Low Hunter Division is open to beginner horse or beginner rider, no cross entries with Open Hunter Division.

JUMPER DIVISION

JUMPERS – To be judged under **Table A Article 3 AM5** – One round with a time allowed and if necessary, a timed jump-off to determine first place.

- 13 **Novice Jumper Open max 2'6" (no cross entry with classes 16, 17, 18)**
- 14* **Jumper Junior max 2'9"**
- 15* **Jumper Senior max 2'9"**
- 16*HQ **Training Jumper Open max 3'0"**
- 17* **Modified Welcome Jumper Open max 3'3"**
- 18* HQ **Open Jumper max 3'6"**

Hunter/Jumper Awards

In order to be considered for a High Point award in the Hunter/Jumper Division, a rider must enter a minimum of 1 Open Hunter class and 2 Jumper classes. The placings from only 1 hunter and 2 jumper classes will be used to calculate high point, not every class entered will count. We will choose the classes with the best placings. (* indicates classes that are recognized as high point classes).

RIDING DIVISION

- 19 HQ **English Pleasure Senior** to be shown at a flat-footed walk, normal trot and easy canter. Not to gallop. To be judged on performance, conformation and manners.
- 20 HQ **English Pleasure Youth/Junior** - same as class 19
- 21 **Walk/Trot Pleasure—English or Western Open** rider may not enter any other riding class except they may enter walk/trot dressage classes.
- 22 **Greenhorse Pleasure Open** - same as class 19 but horse never to have won 3 first place ribbons in a pleasure class under current rider.
- 23 **Basic Seat Equitation – Senior** Rider will be asked to walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Spurs and braiding are optional. **Martingales and tie-downs are prohibited.** Rider to be judged and may be called upon by the Judge for individual work. Fall of the rider constitutes elimination. Any English saddle may be used.
- 24 **Basic Seat Equitation Youth/Junior** - same as class 23
- 25 HQ **Hunter Under Saddle Open - to be shown in the walk, trot and canter both directions of the arena; may be required to hand gallop; light contact with reins is permissible**
- 26 HQ **Road Hack Open** - to be shown at a flat-footed walk, trot, strong trot, canter and hand gallop. Mounting, dismounting and reining back may be requested. Martingales, boots, coloured browbands and nosebands are prohibited. To be judged on performance, conformation, substance and manners.
- 27 HQ **Show Hack Open** – Horses to enter ring at a walk. To be shown on contact in normal, collected and extended gaits at walk, trot, canter. Hand gallop may be required. Horse expected to stand quietly. To be judged on performance, quality, conformation and manners.
- 28 HQ **Fall Fair Challenge Open:** Command Class English or Western
- 29 HQ **Western Pleasure Senior** - Horse to be judged on performance, condition and conformation. Horse to be shown both ways of the ring at all 3 gaits with a reasonably loose rein and light contact. Horses will be required to back up easily and stand quietly. The Judge may request extension of gaits.
- 30 HQ **Western Pleasure Youth/Junior** - same as class 29
- 31 **Greenhorse Pleasure Open** - same as class 29 but horse never to have won 3 first place ribbons in a pleasure class under current rider.
- 32 HQ **Western Equitation Senior** – to be judged on seat, hands, performance of horse, appointment of horse & rider, suitability of horse to rider.
- 33 HQ **Western Equitation Youth/Junior** – same as class 32
- 34 HQ **Reining Open** – Splint and skid boots allowed. Pattern will be posted. May be shown two-handed in snaffle or bosal.

Riding Division Awards

In order to be considered for a High Point award in the Riding Division, a rider must enter a minimum of 3 English classes & 3 Western Classes, (western riding classes will include Trail class # 36 but not gymkhana classes)

DRESSAGE

8:00 am

The new 2011 Dressage Tests will be used, these may be viewed at www.equinecanada.ca select “disciplines”, “dressage”, “dressage tests”, “National tests.”

Classes 1a, 1b, will be ridden in a 20x40 metre arena. Classes 2, 3, 4, 5, 6a, 6b will be ridden in a 20x60 metre arena. An ordinary snaffle bridle must be used; to be ridden with reins in both hands. Spurs and crops are optional.

Higher level tests: Competitors may request to ride other tests of a higher level by phoning the Show Secretary prior to September 16. All tests above First Level ie classes 6a & 6b have been listed as demonstration classes.

- 1a Walk/Trot Test A (no cross entries with classes 2,3,4,5,6)**
- 1b Walk/Trot Test B (no cross entries with classes 2,3,4,5,6)**
- 2 Training Level Test 1**
- 3 Training Level Test 3**
- 4 First Level Test 1**
- 5 First Level Test 3**
- 6a & 6b (demo) any 2 (2011) tests of a higher level**

Times will be posted at the grounds on Friday evening. Riders may phone the Show Secretary to obtain riding times.

It is the responsibility of the exhibitors to ensure they have correct tack. Any discrepancy to the saddlery rules will incur elimination.

If there is only one competitor in a class, the competitor shall compete against a percentage of the total mark.

- 35 Lead Line Horsemanship** – For children 6 years and under. To be led by an adult. The rider will be judged on basic position, seat and ability to properly hold the reins and cue the mount. To be judged at a walk and jog/trot both ways of the ring. May be ridden English or Western. Complimentary ribbons for all.
- 36 Jack Benny Class** open to riders 50 and older to be judged as a pleasure class not restricted as to tack and attire. May be ridden English or Western.
- 37 HQ Trail Horse/Handy Horse Open** -- Horses to be shown at a walk, jog/trot and lope/canter over and through obstacles. May be ridden Western or English. Contestants will be allowed 30 seconds at each obstacle. If obstacle is not negotiated rider must pass on to next and so on. Off course constitutes elimination. No boots or wraps. Horse performance to be judged: 60% - manners; 20% - appointments; 20% - conformation. **NO CROSS ENTRIES WITH CLASS 38.**
- 38 Trail Horse/Handy Horse Beginner**—Western or English attire permitted. Horse and/or rider must be in their first year of showing in trail classes. **NO CROSS ENTRIES WITH CLASS 37.**

1:00pm main arena

- 39 HQ** **Barrel Racing Senior** - No crops, whips, quirts, spurs or over and under ropes. Horse may not be hit with the ends of the reins. Proper bat may be used behind the cinch. May start either right or left following standard cloverleaf pattern. Penalty of 5 seconds for knocking over a barrel. Off course constitutes elimination. This is a timed event.
- 40HQ** **Barrel Racing Youth /Junior** - same as class 39
- 41HQ** **Pole Bending Senior** – No crops, whips, quirts, spurs or over and under ropes. Horses may not be hit with the ends of the reins. Proper bat may be used behind the cinch. Horse and Rider may run down either right or left side of the poles. At sixth pole, turn and weave poles for two laps, then run straight back and cross the finish line. Penalty of 5 seconds per pole knocked over. Off course constitutes elimination. This is a timed event.
- 42HQ** **Pole Bending Youth/Junior** - same as class 41
- 43HQ** **Keyhole Senior** - No crops, whips, quirts, spurs or over and under ropes. Horse may not be hit with the ends of the reins.
- 44HQ** **Keyhole Youth/Junior** – same as class 43

BC PROVINCIAL TREC CHAMPIONSHIP

Open to any horse and rider

Section A **Discovery Level – entry fee \$30 per person (\$25 for TREC BC members)**

Section B **Novice Level – entry fee \$30 per person (\$25 for TREC BC members)**

TREC is a 3 phase competition comprising:

Phase 1 – Orienteering (map reading & trail ride)

Riders copy down a route onto their map and then ride the route at set speeds or within an optimum time, finding route markers and/or check points along the way. This phase can be ridden as an individual, or with one other person. This phase is marked out of 240 points, with penalties awarded for going too fast or too slowly, for missing route markers, taking the wrong route, missing check points etc.

Phase 2 – Control of Paces

Trot (Discovery) or Canter (Novice) along a marked corridor 150m in length, 2m wide, as slowly as possible, then return along the same corridor in the opposite direction in walk (both levels) as fast as possible, without breaking pace or leaving the corridor. Each part of this phase is marked out of 30, with a maximum of 60 points possible.

Phase 3 – Obstacles

A series of natural and simulated obstacles designed to test your ability to negotiate hazards and obstacles you might encounter while out on the trail. Each obstacle is marked out of 10 with points awarded for effectiveness and style. Any obstacle may be missed providing riders present themselves to the relevant obstacle judge first.

Note: At this event it is likely that phases 2 & 3 will be run first, followed by phase 1.

Full rules are available at www.trecbc.ca – but here are the basics:

- Any tack is permitted, but the same tack must be used for all 3 phases.
- Any dress is permitted, providing riders have suitable boots with a heel.
- Riders 18 years and under must wear an approved helmet (SEI/ASTM). It is strongly recommended that all riders wear an approved helmet.
- Riders 16 years and under must be accompanied by an adult on Phase 1.
- All participants must be fully paid up members of HCBC – proof of current membership must be provided with entry.
